WHEREAS: Marcia Neal has served on the State Board of Education

since January 2009; and

WHEREAS: During her term of service, she served as a member from

2009 through 2010, Vice-Chairman from 2011 through 2014 and Chairman in 2015 until she resigned in July

2015; and

WHEREAS: A retired history teacher, Ms. Neal worked with a

combined Social Studies group to revive the critical content

areas of history, geography, economics and financial

literacy within the local curriculum, and;

WHEREAS: With a congressional region that covers almost 2/3 of the

state, Ms. Neal took special interest in rural schools and advocated for their uniqueness as well as their vital importance to the small rural communities; and

WHEREAS: Ms. Neal, along with the Board as a whole, selected Robert

Hammond as Commissioner of Education in 2011; and

WHEREAS: A passionate advocate for School Trust Lands and revenue

they produce, Ms. Neal tirelessly worked to direct attention to this little known area and advocated increased attention to the protection and growth of the Permanent Fund. In

addition, Ms. Neal belonged to the western state's

Children's Land Alliance Supporting Schools (CLASS), a non-profit alliance of educators, state trustee agencies, and others devoted to raising awareness about school trust lands and their impact on school funding for students. Ms. Neal was selected and will remain on the Board of Governors for

CLASS; and

WHEREAS: Ms. Neal was recognized for her work and support of

educators and received the 2014 CASSA Education Leader

Award from the Colorado Association of Senior School Administrators; and

WHEREAS:

Ms. Neal is passionate that a State Board member should focus on supporting local schools and providing a buffer between districts and the sometimes overly political atmosphere; and

WHEREAS:

Over the course of her service, the State of Colorado has undergone tremendous education reforms including the enactment of Colorado's Achievement Plan for Kids, the Innovation Schools Act, the Licensed Personnel Performance Evaluation Act, the Colorado Reading to Ensure Act, and Student Data Privacy. She, along with the Board, as a whole, supported the Department's long-term and ongoing efforts to implement Colorado's education reform agenda.
