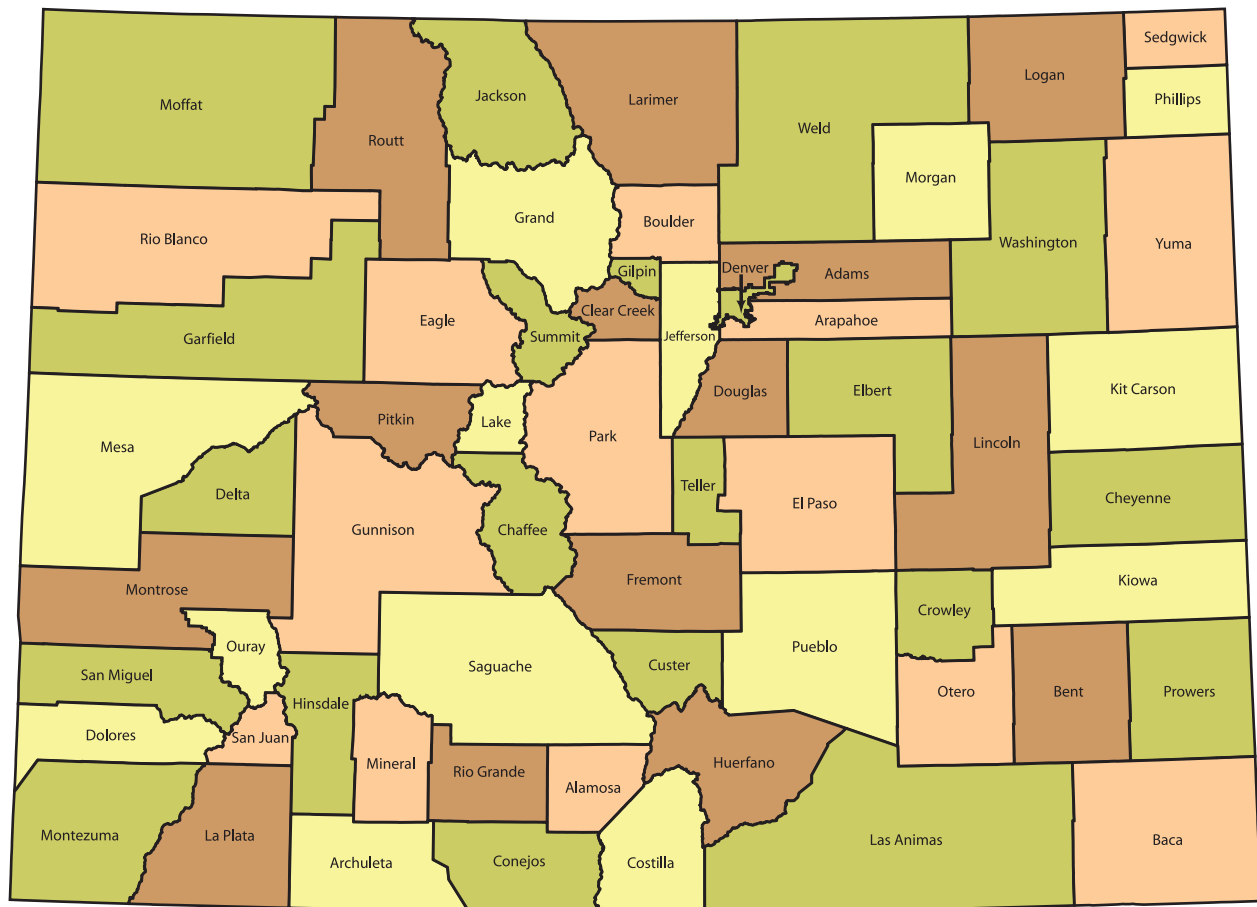


2024-2025 Distribution of State Grants to Libraries

97% of all libraries in the state received funding



The State Grants to Libraries Act (CRS 24-90-401) funded 316 grants, at a minimum of \$4,500, through a \$3 million appropriation from the 2024 Colorado Legislature for educational materials in libraries that support efforts to improve literacy and learning. Amounts listed are the totals received by all libraries in each county. Totals are proportional to the number of libraries in each county.
